Hiring parents who are unemployed temporarily

Offering parent focused programs to provide resources for struggling families.

- Using our social workers to find resources for families as well.
- Allow parents to design programs and give them the support and resources to launch them.
- Focusing on curriculum to deal with the emotional side of family this allows...

- 1. Parents to feel welcome to stay and enjoy.
- 2. Parents respond and react in a relaxed manner by removing the threat (as much as possible) of reprimand or consequence for lack of participation.

 Addressing financial stability with hiring initiatives and entrepreneurship training Offering a partnership fellowship that will allow a worker who stays in our program for 5 years (and completes all requirements.) their own center to create a passive income stream. upon completion Creating virtual programs to teach children how to create a passive income business as early as middle school.

- Reducing the possibility of student debt upon college entry.
- Offer an alternative to traditional college settings.
- Creating school to job pipelines by partnering with schools on fellowships to create teachers.
